Report of the Board President Lynn Barrett



For the last three years, I have had the privilege of serving as President of BCTV's Board of Directors. During my tenure, we've made tremendous strides in a number of areas including upgrades in technology and equipment, new logo, new website and improved community outreach efforts.

A major undertaking was the nearly two and a half years of negotiating with Comcast to renew our contract. The staff, the contract committee and our consultant spent an inordinate number of hours meeting and strategizing to ensure adequate operating and capital funding from Comcast to meet our community needs. This is to acknowledge all of the folks who spent time and energy providing invaluable assistance on the Comcast negotiations. This includes our consultant, Greg Epler Wood, and contract committee members -- Michael Bosworth. Hilary Cooke, Christopher Grotke, Tim Johnson, Ian Kiehle, Jim Maxwell...and myself. Special kudos go to our executive director Cor Trowbridge whose efforts went above and beyond to bring the negotiations to a successful conclusion.

As we look ahead to the coming year, my efforts will be focused on board development and

fundraising. And to continue to oversee our upgrades in equipment and user-friendly technology including the launch of our new website, streaming video so you can watch local programming over the Internet, more and better training opportunities, and new local programming.

I encourage everyone in our community -- individuals, non-profits, local businesses, farmers, artists, entrepreneurs, writers etc., to take advantage of the tools and training that BCTV offers, so that you can produce your own stories and share them with your neighbors and the world at large.

Message from the Executive Director Cor Trowbridge



When I accepted this position in January of 2006, the major event on the horizon was the renewal of BCTV's contract with Adelphia in December 2008. The following year, Comcast purchased Adelphia and suddenly we were heading into negotiations with a new company. A hardy crew of volunteers stepped up to the task, which was anticipated to take 18 months, but lasted almost three years. From the beginning of the Community Needs Assessment process we undertook in May 2007 to the contract

signing in March 2010, Contract Committee members volunteered to attend focus group meetings, make telephone survey calls, tabulate written survey results, proof documents and budgets, meet with Comcast, answer questions, get more information, study the Public Service Board rules, rewrite contract language, and represent the Brattleboro area community in showing how much people care about the station. The bottom line result for BCTV was a 6-year contract that includes (for the first time) annual funding for capital equipment purchases. Another significant milestone this year was the retirement of Harald Holm after nine years on staff. Harald started as a volunteer in 1999 and joined the staff in 2001 part-time. His first job was to keep the SCALA bulletin board program up to date, and he gradually took on more responsibility until he was working full time and in charge of scheduling programs to run on both channels. Harald's attention to detail and tireless work ethic served BCTV well and we are forever grateful. He will continue to assist us in a consultant capacity.

What's next? We are continuing to follow our strategic Access Plan of 2008, purchasing equipment that is technologically current and user-friendly to make the production process as easy as possible. The next big goal is to update our website with live streaming and video on demand functionality. This project was initiated last winter, and we have just finalized the design for the new website. This will increase access to BCTV's local programming for area residents as TV and the internet continue to merge.

Another focus this year is the petition by Southern Vermont Cable to renew its Certificate of Public Good. Residents of towns in the SVC service territory only receive Channel 8 and the signal quality is poor. We are working now to improve the overall signal quality of our channels, and coming to a new agreement with SVC is critical to meeting this goal. I look forward to reporting on our success at the next annual meeting!

Financial Statement

BCTV provides local programming through Comcast channels 8 and 10 to over 4,700 subscriber households in Brattleboro, Guilford and Vernon. Channel 8 can also be viewed in Putney, Dummerston, Jamaica, Townshend, and Newfane through an agreement with Southern Vermont Cable. This year's financial statement reflects an increase in franchise fees from Comcast subscribers while expenses remained stable due to the retirement of one staff member.

BCTV offers the following trainings in the Fall, Winter and Spring. If there is a waiting list for a particular training, we schedule another session.

- <u>Basic Video Production</u>: 4-hour training covers how to operate a video camera, basic composition and lighting techniques, how to record good audio, and pre- and post-production planning.
- <u>Editing with Final Cut</u>: 4-hour training to learn the basics of Final Cut Pro, including capturing footage, cutting, as well as adding transitions, special effects, titles and audio tracks.
- <u>Basic Studio Production</u>: 4-hour training introduces the technical and conceptual skills to produce or crew on a program in BCTV's studio and control room. Hands-on instruction on cameras, tripods, set design, lighting, switcher, audio board and mikes, video playback and recording, and graphic design.
- <u>Custom/Individual Trainings</u>: BCTV accommodates requests for on-site trainings for nonprofit groups and individuals to learn the skills necessary to shoot under specific conditions.
- Workshops: Single-session workshops include Video Uploading and DVD Authoring.





Summer Youth Video Camp - This summer BCTV expanded our youth video camp to offer two one-week sessions, each for a different age group and one week apart. The first session had 12 campers, age 9-12, who created a zombie video called "A Midsummer's Nightmare." The *Brattleboro Reformer* did a front-page article about the video and the camp, which was very positive exposure. The second session had 9 campers ages 11-14. The video was called "Pizza Apocalypse" and featured a giant penguin foot crushing everyone in sight. Both camps resulted in many happy campers at BCTV.

The Landmark Report – This was the third spring that Landmark College Broadcast Journalism professor Ellen Wood brought her students from Putney to BCTV to learn studio production techniques and produce "The Landmark Report," including news, sports, opinion & weather.

Equipment Use

Due to the purchase of new cameras and editing suites, both production and editing equipment use increased by 30% this year. New Sony Z5U camcorders enable producers to capture footage simultaneously on compact flash cards and mini-DV tape, and in high definition and standard definition. This year's capital budget will allow for the purchase of a new switcher/mixer for the BCTV studio and make it more user-friendly and technologically current.



Programming

Local programming on BCTV increased almost 15% this year. This is due to a higher number of active producers and the purchase of more user-friendly production equipment. Imported programming also increased because the TelVue broadcast server we purchased last year enabled BCTV to play programming 24/7, so we could show longer regional and statewide interest programs from the Vermont Media Exchange and overnight programming from Free Speech TV, a nonprofit satellite channel.
