

From the Board President

As BCTV observes its 45th year serving the community, we are *mostly* extricated from the travails of the COVID-19 pandemic. As Cor notes in her section of this report, the staff has done an amazing job finding ways to keep the facilities open and accessible to all members of the community.

I can tell you the board engaged in many thoughtful discussions over the past year about how the organization should operate under the current public health circumstances, and we had to weigh BCTV's commitment to serving the entire community in some cases against our personal beliefs. Frankly, we had consensus to craft a very different policy than what is currently in place. I hope those who are benefiting from this decision appreciate the compromises we made, and I hope all others who utilize BCTV's services feel sufficiently protected.

One business accomplishment I'd like to highlight is the renewal of our contract with Comcast to provide PEG services to area cable subscribers. This had been a "to-do" item that dated all the way back to the start of my tenure on the board seven years ago and was delayed at the state level. While legal documents always come with a certain level of back-and-forth and procedural gymnastics, I feel all parties worked in good faith toward a solution that benefits Vermonters and sustains BCTV's ability to be a community asset for the next seven years.

Finally, I'd like to acknowledge the two new board members who joined BCTV a year ago: attorney George Anthes and filmmaker Garret Harkawik. Both of them have proven their willingness to roll up their sleeves and actively work toward ensuring this organization moves forward. I thank them and my other fellow board members – Alex Beck, Bob Gammon, Leah Goodman, Marty Cohn, and Lynn Barrett—for everything they do on behalf of BCTV. It is an honor to be counted among them.

From the Executive Director

Cor Trowbridge



At the beginning of this fiscal year, July 1, 2020, BCTV was a week from reopening after the initial COVID-19 shutdown. We were excited to be back in person after a long late winter and spring of operating entirely from home. Producers returned to the studio and edit suites, and we figured out how to cope with the Municipal Center door being locked and all the sanitizing that had to take place before and after an in-person visit. Then in mid-November, the Governor ordered the second Stay at Home Order and we closed again, this time for eight months, all the way through the end of the fiscal year. When I put together this report, I had to keep reminding myself that BCTV was closed to the public for almost 40% of the year.

What happened? Livestreaming happened. BCTV staff became experts at livestreaming to Facebook, YouTube, and our cable channel simultaneously. We helped performing arts venues reach remote audience members. We helped nonprofits hold virtual fundraisers. We co-hosted Town Meeting Info Sessions on Zoom for our eight towns in place of in-person town meeting coverage -- all in the same week. We livestreamed candidate interviews, drive-through trick-or-treating on Halloween, election coverage, the Mars Rover landing, ice hockey, and graduations. Meanwhile, community members were also learning to livestream, from Gallery Walk, to Zoom forums, church services and arts performances, creating more local content to air and archive. Municipal meetings we once covered in person, then online, became hybrid -- in person with remote attendance -- placing an entirely new set of technical demands on our field staff. Volunteers continued to record events and edit at home on our new laptops, with remote tech support. While we produced fewer programs and equipment use was diminished, hours of programming increased due to online meetings being much longer than in person.

Financially, we were fortunate to be recipients of a PPP loan, forgiven in this fiscal year, as well as a COVID Relief Grant from the State. Our renewed contract with Comcast and its acquisition of Southern Vermont Cable increased cable fees, and we had the support of generous donors and sponsors who knew this was a critical year to step up for nonprofits.

I'm grateful for our financial stability this year, and for the positive attitude displayed by board and staff members as we navigated the competing demands for access with those for public health and safety. BCTV shows its best qualities when learning and growing, and this year pushed us like no other. Onward!100

Equipment & Facilities Use

BCTV's field camera kits include the Canon Vixia, XA10, XA20 and XA15, and one DSLR, the Canon 80D. This year's statistics fluctuate widely from past years because the office was open for only 100 days or 38% of the year. When we were closed, equipment checkouts were available by appointment and typically lasted one week. Two of the editing suites were located at home with staff for most of the year and hours were not tracked. Two Macbook Pro laptops were purchased for checkout and staff supplied remote assistance to home editors.

Volunteers and Interns

Volunteers contribute to BCTV by serving on the board, being a crew member, hosting interviews, or providing commentary for live events. Interns edit projects, digitize archives, operate cameras, and create their own videos. For FY21, however, all of our volunteer crew productions were canceled (such as parades, Harris Hill Ski Jump) and we limited graduations to staff. Intern participation decreased due to the office being closed and staff working remotely.



Programming Hours

BCTV produces an average of 1200 hours of local content annually, which is equivalent to the output of much larger stations. This year's hours were high due to the number of extremely long online meetings and the increase in livestreamed events by BCTV staff. Livestreamed meetings and events were counted in addition to their first run playout. Locally-created programs constitute approximately half of what you see on BCTV, measured both by duration (hours and minutes) and by count (number of programs). Vermont Media Exchange is BCTV's primary source of imported programming, which carries programs produced by community media stations across Vermont and shared through a statewide network.

Awards

Locally, BCTV was named in the June 2021 Edition of the Brattleboro Reformer's "Windham County Unsung Heroes 2021." Nominated by Jim Levinson of Compassionate Brattleboro, the citation calls BCTV "an indispensable connection during a pandemic."

On a national level, BCTV received two 2021 Hometown Media Awards from the Alliance for Community Media:

- New England Youth Theatre and Broad Brothers' video, "NEYT's Romeo and Juliet in COVID Times" was named the Winner in the category of Local Performances, Student Division.
- BCTV submitted excerpts from 15 shows aired in 2020 and was named the Winner for Overall Excellence in P.E. or G. Access for budgets under \$300,000. This is the fourth time BCTV has won this award recognizing the breadth and depth of our staff and volunteer producers' work compared to other stations of our size.


